SEPTEMBER

- 12 Fifty-four football players eagerly greet Mr. Blake (only 1 return-
 ing letterman).
- 13 Masters Meeting — Mr. C. H. Toll (English), Mr. W. Swift (Mathe-
 matics), Mr. G. E. Studds (History), Mr. P. S. Godfrey (English),
 Mr. P. J. Sheehan (English), Mr. and Mrs. Richmond (Advanced
 Studies Program), Mr. and Mrs. Powell (organist), Mr. and Mrs.
 Marsh (French), Mr. and Mrs. Talbert (School Engineer), and Dr.
 and Mrs. Shaw (School Physician) are welcomed as the new members
 of the faculty. The Clarks are away on Sabbatical; Mr. Burnham
 and Mr. Mehegan are on leave of absence; and Mr. McDonald,
 Mr. Eddy, the Prestons and Walkers return.
 Meanwhile, Messrs. Chapman and Kip were married over the
 summer.
- 14 129 New boys arrive.
- 15 School Registration at 449. Work on converting Hargate into a
 new art studio began during the summer. Major landscaping for
 chapel lawn and flagpole area. Tuck shop and Art's store moved
 to the Lower. Gas House to be redesigned as a Post Office. In
 short, almost \$800,000 to be spent on changes.
- 18 President Moorhead addresses the School.
- 23 Justice Byron "Whizzer" White arrives as first Conroy Fellow.

OCTOBER

- 1 School notified of the death of Mrs. Oates.
- 2 Football takes Groton 24-0, but SPS only ties Mr. Honea's boys 0-0
 in Soccer.
- 6 KUA slips by Soccer 1-0.
- 9 *Nutriment* responsible for upset victory over Milton in football.
 Soccer stages 2-1 win over Mt. Hermon. Exeter erases cross country
 15-50.
- 13 Soccer never loses to Exeter! This year the score was 1-0. Cross
 country loses at Tilton.
- 16 Football comes from behind to humiliate Vermont Academy 26-21,
 but V.A. takes cross country. Soccer takes Browne and Nichols 2-0.
- 20 G.D.A. bites the dust 1-0 in soccer, but pick up easy win against
 cross country.
- 22 Harriers taken by Concord High.
- 23 SPS football wins fourth straight 26-8 from stunned Browne and
 Nichols team. Soccer ties New Hampton 1-1.
- 27 Soccer and, of course, cross country are dumped by the Big Bad
 Blue Bullies of Andover. End of Marking Period . . . TENSE!
- 29 *School for Scandal*, classy art show, stars André Bishop and Charles
 Heckscher.

- 30 Parents Weekend — Winchendon begins its year of surprises by upsetting SPS football. Soccer trounces Brooks 2-0 with Mark Mayer scoring the only goals. But wait, hold on! CROSS COUNTRY smashes New Hampton 18-45! "Weenie Man" sells out: Mish racket at peak!

NOVEMBER

- 3 Soccer continues strong by defeating Tilton 1-0.
 5 Girls arrive for Dance Weekend. Concord stays opened late.
 6 Athletics suffer from late nights: Fryeburg "Fries" SPS 24-7, soccer ties Dublin 1-1, and cross country finishes second to last at Interscholastics. "Weenie Girl" fails to snake any Paulies.
 7 Couples recuperate — enjoy box lunches.
 10 Soccer stuns Dartmouth and Jim Treadway 2-1.
 13 Williston clobbers football 44-8 in rain.
 16 Struthers makes superb run around Lower School Pond in House and cross country run. Simply fantastic!
 17 Curtis String Quartet rocks in Library. 50th anniversary of the Squash Courts. Mr. Mohibullah Khan and Mr. Robert Hetherington take on Terrell.
 24 Thanksgiving Time Out.
 28 School welcomes students back. Mr. Becroft was married during the holiday.

DECEMBER

- 4 End of Marking Period! College Boards: computers at work.
 6 Examinations begin week of cramming.
 15 Homeward Bound. Choate Canadians beat Paulies 6-3 at the Garden. Hockey goes on to finish third place at Lawrenceville.

JANUARY

- 4 School tries to return.
 12 Basketball bows to Winchendon 50-39. Hockey also loses to Deerfield 2-1.
 13 Dave Brubeck arrives. A great success!
 15 SPS loses in hockey, basketball, and skiing. Forget the scores!
 19 Basketball over Lawrence 51-42; squash triumphs over Dartmouth 6-1; hockey takes Middlesex 6-2; but skiers bow to New Hampton.
 22 Basketball overwhelms St. Mark's 57-50. Terrell leads squash to 7-0 victory, hockey and skiing fall.
 25 St. Paul's Day.
 26 Skiing and Pit win. Hockey loses to Dartmouth 6-2, and squash is taken by Andover 4-1.
 29 Hockey beats Hebron 4-1. Basketball takes Groton 51-48. Squash over Exeter 3-2. Skiers place last at KUA Carnival.

FEBRUARY

- 2 Basketball wins fourth straight 57-38. Hockey over Exeter 5-1. Squash takes Brooks 7-0, and Snow Club revives by defeating Dublin.
 3 Snows 2 2/3 inches today. No spring term studies program!
 4 Surprise Holiday.
 5 Holiday takes its toll: Skiers lose to Andover and Proctor. Noble and Greenough slaughters Pit 50-29. Squash over Middlesex 6-1. Belmont Hill overwhelms hockey 6-1.
 9 Pit startles Belmont 67-60. Terrell takes Whitman in Harvard "B" match — team wins overall 3-2. Ski team down Dublin. However, Harvard Freshmen shellacks hockey 10-2.
 11 Winter Dance Weekend.
 12 Loomis grabs winning goal late in 3rd period to take Alumni Yale Freshmen 4-3. Mish talent show features Jug Band, and Charlie Gagarin wins Yamaha. "Weenie Man" returns in fine form.
 16 Basketball dwarfed by Gov. Dummer, but stays in ball game until the end, 49-37. Andover ringers beat Raquet Men 3-2, and ski team falls to Holderness.
 19 B&N wallops Basket Weavers 89-34. Deerfield defeats squash 4-1, and Andover pulls another lucky win in hockey 3-1; but skiers smash Concord High in a four event spectacular.
 20 —19°F . . . coldest day of school year.
 23 SPS humiliated by Middlesex in basketball 45-32. Hockey drops easy game to KUA 3-2. Tilton outpoints ski team. Luckily squash takes Middlesex 5-2.
 26 Terrell places first in Interscholastics by defeating Carry of Deerfield. Pit holds off Roxbury Latin 54-52. Bowdoin Freshmen over hockey 7-2. Sixth Form Show — *Hello Molly!* Bishop directs cast of thousands.

MARCH

- 1 †Mr. Matthews ('61) joins faculty as a classics teacher. National Merit Tests!
 2 John Evans and Dick Whalen host at successful Boxing Exhibition.
 5 Terrell leads squash to 5-0 victory over MIT. Skiing starts slow at Proctor Interscholastics. **College Boards nail V formers.**
 6 Skiers end up fairly well at Interscholastics.
 10 School hits the South and Slopes.
 30 Students return to compare tans. Mr. Eddy was married over vacation.

APRIL

- 7 Cadmeans filibuster Concordians to defeat.
 8 Good Friday.
 10 Easter.

- 15 College letters (bones) sent. Only 7 for 30 at Yale. Good luck to VI form next year.
- 20 B-Ball takes Bishop Brady 8-6 in season opener. Tufts falls to Lax 7-5.
- 23 Mike Blake leads Concord High to 6-5 win over baseball. Exeter overpowers stickmen 9-1. Marking Period Ends.
- 24 V form elections: John Landes, etc.
- 27 SPS Lax torques out — takes Lawrence 11-2. B-Ball subdues Proctor 6-0.
- 30 Mr. Edward Weeks, retired Senior Editor of *Atlantic Monthly* captivates audience. Holderness leaves Lax in the dust 6-4. KUA pulls away from baseball 10-9, but tennis takes Orange 8-1. "Mish Mash" — Dance Weekend boys in for a surprise.

- 14 Milton downs tennis 7½-2½. Bowdoin loses to good Lax effort 7-4. Baseball 12-7 over New Hampton. Track loses to Concord 62½-59½.
- 16 A. P. Week. Crews up early.
- 18 Lax comes from behind to beat KUA 5-4. B-Ball 11-1 victors over Tilton. Dummer loses in tennis 5-4. Crews wipe Andover out of pond!!!
