- 28 Soccer takes Groton 2-0.
Football drops opener to Groton 6-0.
- 30 Cricket Holiday. New Boys travel to Hampton Beach for frigid swim.

OCTOBER

- 2 Soccer loses to KUA in overtime 2-1.
- 5 Mt. Hermon soccer triumphs 4-1 while Football dumps Milton 20-14 in thriller. Cross Country loses first meet to Milton 27-30.
- 9 Soccer edged by Exeter 1-0. Strong Tilton Cross Country Team wins 18-37.
- 12 Soccer defeats Browne and Nichols 2-1.
Football rolls over St. Sebastian's 30-0.
Cross Country loses 3rd straight to powerful Vermont Academy 20-38.
Parents' Weekend.
- 16 Cross Country solidly defeats Governor Dummer 18-43, as Soccer also wins 1-0 against Governor Dummer.
- 17 Missionary Society's Coffee House opens where informal discussions take on new dimensions.

- 19 Football defeats Browne and Nichols 26-12 while Soccer takes New Hampton 2-1. Cross Country beats New Hampton with perfect score, 15-50.
- 20 Ric Masten plays and sings for library audience.
- 23 Soccer bitterly gives up game to Andover 2-1. Cross Country loses to overpowering Andover 15-49.
- 25 Heyoka Indian Dancers from Lowell, Massachusetts visit SPS. Soccer takes measure of Brooks by 4-2 score. Winchendon edges Football Team 20-16. Cross Country beats Proctor Academy 25-35 and ends season with record of 3 wins, 4 losses.
- 30 Soccer wins again — smashes Tilton 3-1.
- 31 City Center Joffrey Ballet visits SPS for 3 days, and they are given fantastic, warm welcome.

NOVEMBER

- 2 Soccer meets and defeats Dublin 3-1. Football clinches winning season with resounding 36-0 win over Lawrence.
- 6 Dartmouth Frosh sneak by Soccer 3-1, ending Soccer's season with a 7-5 record.
- 8 Dance Weekend begins.
- 9 Football clobbers Brooks 20-9, ending season with 5-2 mark.
- 12 Thanksgiving cross country race; Delphians win.
- 14 Ski Team begins workouts for long season ahead.
- 26 Tom Rush plays 15 songs for School in Memorial Hall.
- 27 Thanksgiving Recess, long-awaited, begins.

DECEMBER

- 1 Boys return from Thanksgiving feast and rest.
- 3 Alumni Art Exhibit opens in New York City; 500 Alumni in attendance; great success.
- 4 Basketball's 12 players take opener with Berwick Academy 56-42. Hockey scrimmages Proctor Academy and plays well enough to win, 6-0.
- 6 Master Players present play "Androcles and the Lion."
- 7 Hockey Team taken by Concord 4-3; awaits strong Choate team at Madison Square Garden. College Boards for apprehensive 6th. Form.
- 18 School departs for "not long enough" but much welcomed Christmas Vacation. Hockey meets Choate in Garden and plays to a 3-3 tie.

JANUARY

- 6 Students slowly return to customary places after Vacation.
- 8 Squash at Harvard: they win easily 4-1. Deerfield administers trouncing in Hockey 8-0.
- 11 College Boards again !!!!! SPS Squash easily beats a weak Milton team 5-0. Skiing beats Andover at Proctor 193.8-192.4. Basketball steps on Milton 62-50 while Noble and Greenough shuts us out 5-0.
- 15 The Rector announces coeducational exchange between SPS and Concord Academy. SPS Skiing easily beats New Hampton 196-179. Lawrence Basketball pulls out win with last-second basket 59-57. Concord High wins again in Hockey 3-2.
- 16 Conroy Fellow Ralph J. Bunche visits school for 3 days and explains world issues, implications and the U. N.
- 18 Skiing narrowly defeats Deerfield 194-192. Basketball easily beats St. Mark's 48-33 while Milton Hockey turns the tables on SPS 5-2. SPS Squash thoroughly dumps Brooks 7-0.
- 22 Skiing at Holderness leaves SPS on bottom: Tilton 239, Holderness 238 and SPS 237. Basketball wins another against Brooks 61-45, Squash fights hard and narrowly wins against Andover 3-2.
- 25 St. Paul's Day. Skiing gets 4th. out of 6 schools in inter-scholastics. Hockey registers win over St. Mark's 3-0. Squash wins every game against Groton 5-0, as Basketball also makes it a bad day for Groton 60-43.
- 29 Skiing beats Dublin 95-84 and Squash wins at Brooks 6-1. Rivers takes BB team in overtime 52-45 and a hustling Hockey team beats Exeter 6-4.

FEBRUARY

- 1 Basketball loses to Noble and Greenough 37-34. Skiing at Proctor with Andover: SPS 197; Andover 186; Proctor 183. Squash loses to a fine Middlesex team by 6-1 score and Belmont Hill overpowers SPS on the ice 9-1.
- 4 Pain and agony: College Boards.
- 5 Skiing takes Dublin 195-166. SPS Squash aces beat Exeter 3-2. Basketball gets a dose of hard luck and loses to Belmont Hill 61-55. Browne and Nichols Hockey shoots and wins 6-1.
- 7 Dance Week-end.
- 8 Yale Hockey: we lose totally and completely 11-0. Dance Weekend crowd moves Basketball team against Winchendon 62-45.

- 12 Squash loses to Andover 3-2. Basketball plays a great game and wins at Governor Dummer 72-51. Hockey shoots wildly but manages to put one in for 1-0 victory over Dummer.
- 15 Skiers ski past Exeter 191-180. Squash loses, a disappointing loss, to Deerfield 3-2. Andover's powerhouse beats us in Hockey 5-1 but not before we played well. Basketball crushed by Browne and Nichols 59-33.
- 19 Basketball scores a great win against Middlesex 66-44. Middlesex Hockey turns the tables and shuts out SPS 5-0.
- 22 BB ekes out 58-57 win over Roxbury and ends successful season with a record of 9-5.
Hockey wins a convincing one for a change against Brooks 8-3.
- 26 KUA smashes our skaters 10-2.

- 1 School life is made tedious: College Boards encore.
- 13 Spring vacation — restful alternative to a life of study.

Spring Term

APRIL

- 1 School returns with dreams and memories.
- 16 Conroy Fellow, Hon. Charles E. Bohlen stays through the 20th. Lacrosse smears Tufts Frosh by 10-3 score.
- 19 Lacrosse cleanly shuts out Exeter 8-0. Track relays with Exeter cancelled due to inclement weather; Baseball also meets foul weather necessitating postponement of season's opener.
- 23 Lacrosse plays a sloppy game but manages to beat Lawrence, 9-1. Proctor baseball is clearly beaten 25-3. SPS shuts out Berwick in Tennis 9-0.
- 26 Baseball squeaks by Concord High 3-2; Lax steps on New Hampton hopes 12-3. Strong Milton Track contingent defeats us 81-43. Tennis whitewashes Winchendon 9-0.
- 30 Baseball loses to Kimball Union 3-1; Lacrosse thumps a big Deerfield team 12-6. Track emerges victorious against New Hampton but loses to KUA; KUA 68-SPS-48-N.H.-46.
Andover tennis hands our squad a disappointing 5-4 loss.

MAY

- 2 College Boards strike again!!
Varsity Baseball loses to a strong Berwick team 11-3.
J.V. Lacrosse beats Holderness J.V. 5-0, while the Varsity edges a spirited team from Winchendon 7-4.

- 7 Proctor Lax is overwhelmed by us 11-4; J.V. Lax wins against New Hampton 4-1 and Tennis loses another squeaker 5-4 to Exeter.
- 9 Dance Week-end begins and continues through the 11th. Weather ideal.
- 10 Concord High defeats Track team 80-51 while Baseball wins against a weak-hitting New Hampton team 9-1. Lacrosse wins, but sloppily, in a game too close for comfort 2-1 against Holderness. Tennis takes 18 of 25 sets from Milton and the SPS Crew has 3 victories in 4 boats against Mt. Hermon.
- 12 Advanced Placement Exams — continue through the 10th.
- 14 Lawrence J.V. Lacrosse loses to SPS 10-0. Varsity Lax beats a rough, but inexperienced, Kimball Union team 12-2.
Baseball shuts out Tilton by 5-0 score and Tennis posts easy triumph against Governor Dummer. First SPS boat wins, Second loses against Andover crews.
- 17 J.V. Lax continues winning ways and beats Vermont Academy 9-0. Harvard Frosh easily beat us in crew despite excellent effort. Track loses to overpowering Governor Dummer Team 95-36. Baseball wins over Middlesex 7-4 in 11 innings. Lacrosse forced into overtime with Governor Dummer but wins 6-5. Tennis suffers another setback losing to Groton, a definite disappointment.
- 21 Baseball loses 10 inning thriller to Groton 4-3. Tennis overpowers New Hampton 17-1. Lacrosse loses to Andover for the New England Championship 6-3.
- 24 Worcester Regatta and SPS first crew places third and second crew second. Track team overwhelms Vermont Academy 109-22. Tennis with Dartmouth cancelled due to rain. Baseball edges Governor Dummer 9-8; Mt. Hermon beats a disappointed Lax team 4-2 in the rain.
- 28 Baseball drops 7-4 decision to Mt. Hermon, but Tennis gains revenge by 9-0 score over the Hermies. Lacrosse plays well and defeats Dartmouth Frosh 7-2, ending season with 11-2 log. Lower School Boat Races: Halcyons capture 1, 3, 4, boats and Shattucks the second.
- 30 Anniversary Week-end begins; as do Exams. Baseball concludes fine season by winning a twin-bill from Belmont Hill by 1-0 and 9-1 scores. Ends season with 8-5 record.
- 31 Anniversary Track Meet: Old Hundreds win with the Isthmians taking second and the Delphians placing a distant third. Shattucks, taking all but the first boat, dominate the Anniversary Boat Races before huge crowd of onlookers.
